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Answers to some of the most frequently asked questions:

In the fraternity, you can use the network of members who already take advantage of campus resources such as the library, computer and math labs, and job placement centers. Most fraternities offer educational workshops on study skills, time management, stress management, study hall/hours, in-house tutors, and award and incentive programs to help you achieve academic success. You are responsible for your own success but fraternity membership can help you reach your academic goals.

I heard fraternities emphasize leadership. What opportunities will I have?

In fraternities, you're in charge. Everyone is a leader, whether you're an officer or committee member, you'll find everyone working together for common goals. You'll learn how to manage a budget, run a meeting, speak in public, and motivate others...skills that will help you throughout your life. It takes more than just a degree to get that great job!

What about Hazing?

Hazing is absolutely forbidden. You do NOT have to prove yourself. Each fraternity does have expectations of their members and those should be explained to you during recruitment. If they are not, ASK what will be expected of you as a new member.

Does it cost a lot to be a member?

Fraternities are not expensive. Each fraternity is self supported from dues paid by members. If housing is offered, lodging and meals are very competitive with other housing options.

What about community service?

Whether raising funds for a charity or volunteering your time to help others, you'll see that fraternities are committed so serving others. From volunteering at a local elementary school to blood drives, service is a fun and important part of the fraternity experience.

What type of guy joins a fraternity?

ALL TYPES. While many men join as freshmen, many sophomores, juniors, and transfer students also join. Having members with different backgrounds and experiences is what makes the fraternity a great organization. Each individual gets to share his talents!
