WHAT TO EXPECT

UIFI will be an exciting and memorable experience. You will join approximately 80 student participants and 14-16 other facilitators during your stay at the institute. If you bring an open mind, a willingness to take risks, a caring and positive attitude, and a readiness to have some fun...we guarantee a great experience!

You can also expect:

- Fraternity and sorority leaders from across North America who want to lead their communities to new levels of excellence
- Early mornings and late nights! Make sure to come well-rested.
- A substance-free environment. There's no time, room, or need for alcohol and drugs
- Thorough training by Lead Facilitators
- An experiential curriculum with interactive exercises and in-depth discussions
- Warm/hot days, cool evenings
- Beautiful fraternity/sorority house accommodations
- New friends, new ideas, new experiences, and new directions

WHAT WE EXPECT FROM YOU

1. Facilitators are expected to cover their own travel expenses to and from the UIFI host sites. NIC covers all lodging and meal expenses and provides materials for the program.
2. Facilitators will make UIFI a priority over invitations to other summer programs.
3. Review all advance mailings and training materials prior to arriving for your session.
4. Provide input to NIC staff regarding any element of UIFI.
5. Adhere to the curriculum developed by the NIC. This includes conducting all exercises, meetings, and small group activities as outlined in the Facilitator Guide, and not omitting or adding curriculum pieces without the expressed approval of the Lead Facilitators.
6. Keep in contact with the students from your UIFI chapter at least four times per year following the UIFI program.



7. Participate fully in the UIFI session from beginning to end. Participate in all activities and meetings and make yourself available to participants during free time. Facilitators must agree to not conduct business (i.e. use of cell phones, email) during UIFI activities.
8. Respect the policies, procedures, and standards of the North-American Interfraternity Conference, Fraternity Executives Association, National Panhellenic Conference, National Pan-Hellenic Council, National Association of Latino Fraternal Organizations (NALFO), National APIA Panhellenic Association (NAPA), and the National Multicultural Greek Council (NMGC).
9. Live in the chapter house during the entire program. Eat all meals with session participants, sleep in provided housing.
10. Support the substance-free policy of UIFI. Share this expectation with students and assist in holding them accountable to it.
11. Campus fraternity/sorority advisors should register at least one student from your campus and fraternity/sorority volunteers/staff should encourage your organization to sponsor students of your affiliation to participate in UIFI.
12. Facilitators who drive may be asked to assist with special situations such as providing transportation for airport transportation, etc.
13. Come prepared with a positive attitude and a willingness to take risks and have fun!
